New Year Message by ELF-RC Chairman

The year 2007 was another year of untold suffering and injustices meted out by Isaias Afeworki and his PFDJ against the Eritrean people. The condition of our people was indescribable and, for lack of the right words, one can in short call it "a very bad situation which must not continue as it has been." It was during 2007 that the lack of peace and security climbed to their worst levels. Lawlessness, violation of human rights, further collapse of the already basic economic condition, and free-fall of social and family values added acceleration in 2007. In short, the year under review was not a better period in the life of our people for it proved to be another year of increased fear and incarceration; a year of worsened livelihood and hunger; a year of more sicknesses and deaths; a year that witnessed increasing ignorance and lack of education, a year of escalating displacement and new tragedies.

The cruelties lived Mengistu Hailemariam and his Dergue regime lasted for 17 years and ended by the joint struggle of our people. Dictator Isaias Afeworki and his PFDJ

But the suffering of the entire nation is so intolerable that our people are not willing to remain under the yoke of this evil regime for more than 17 years.
